

In the Garden Centre

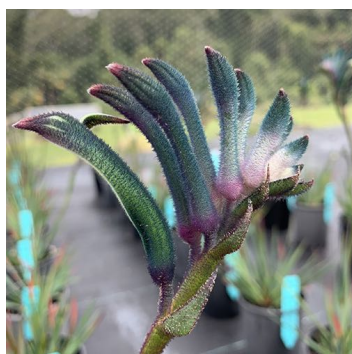

CONTAINER VEGETABLE GROWING.

Everyone can grow their own produce even if have no access to a garden.

Vegetables and herbs love growing in pots and any container that you can fill with soil and drains will be able to grow vegetables.

The easiest options to get started with are leafy greens and herbs. Plant up an old bucket or large pot with a mix of rocket, lettuce and spinach or plant parsley with an underplanting of strawberries and grow your own. It is that easy.

Give your plants some good light and liquid feed monthly to keep them green and growing well. Leafy greens and herbs are best if you can continuously trim the growth so that they provide you with an endless supply of fresh leaves.

Choose lettuces that do not heart so you can pick the outside leaves every few days.

Pak Choy,, Bok choy, Rocket, Lettuces, Celery, Spring Onions, Silverbeet and Sorrel are all plants you can cut the tops off and they will continue to grow new leaves. This makes eating your own produce very simple.

Lilly pillies are a hardy native plant that can suit all styles of garden. We have lovely topiary standards of Big Red & Backyard Bliss that would be perfect for formal gardens.

Lilly pillies can be used for formal & informal hedging from 50cm height to 6m plus. Syzygium Cascade is a lush, somewhat weeping plant, with lovely new pink foliage.

Resilience & Fire Screen are the best for large, dense screening while Backyard Bliss & Straight and Narrow are good for 1m wide screening in narrow areas.

Allyn Magic is perfect for creating compact low balls or dwarf hedging to 1m only.

Plant in Native Mix with a cover of chip mulch and fertilise with Neutrog Bush Tucker for healthy growth.

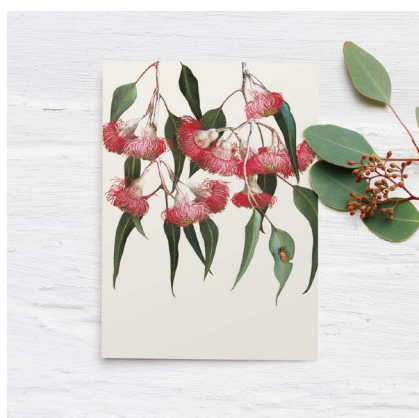
Cut flower and cut foliage varieties

We have a broad range of plants suitable to grow for cut flower and foliage in store now. There is nothing nicer than picking a bunch of foliage and flowers from your garden to place on your table.

Eucalyptus and acacia varieties are popular foliage plants that make a wonderful display in a vase for your home. We have dwarf Eucalyptus in that can be regularly trimmed to create both a stunning feature in the garden as well beautiful cut flowers and gum nuts.

These are some of the cut flowers we have at the moment, our range changes and increases each week. Philotheca, leptospermum, kangaroo paws, eremophila nivea, straw flowers, paper daisies, hakea burrendong beauty, geraldton wax, acacia, eucalyptus baby blue and thryptomene.

There are also many non native plants great for cut flowers and foliage such as Magnolia 'Teddy Bear', Magnolia 'Little Gem', Leucospermum, Leucadendron, Serruria, Statice and Proteas.

New Season Trees

Trees are so important for healthy environments but they also have benefits of bringing beauty to your garden. We have a wide variety of trees from Fleming's Nurseries, that create a show of blossom through the Spring months. This can either be ornamental or fruiting blossom trees. Some of the best are Ornamental and Fruiting Plum, Peach, Apricot, Pear and Cherry. Other great blossom trees are Cercis and Crabapple.

Beautiful Maples- Acer palmatum 'Atropurpureum', Acer palmatum 'Osakazuki', Acer palmatum 'Sango Kaku', Acer palmatum 'Shaina', Acer rubrum 'October Glory®', Acer Autumn Blaze and our range of Weeping Dissectum Lace Leaf Maple.

Coloured foliage all year - Cercis canadensis 'Forest Pansy', Prunus cerasifera 'Nigra', Prunus 'Oakville Crimson Spire', Sambuca nigra 'Black Lace', Ulmus glare 'Lutescens'.

Blossom trees- Prunus mume 'Splendens', Prunus cerasifera 'Oakville Crimson Spire', Prunus nigra, Malus 'Sugar Tyme', Malus 'Raspberry Spear', Pyrus 'Korean Sun'.

Mop top & weeping trees - Robinia Mop Top, Morus alba 'Pendula', Catalpa bignonioides, Prunus Snow Fountains, Acer dissectum and Prunus fruticosa 'Globosa'.

Cherry Blossom - We have Prunus Mount Fuji, Weeping Prunus Snow Fountain and Pink Cascade and Standard Cherry Prunus fruticosa 'Globosa'.
